Overview

LightSail is our exciting new platform for Independent Reading as well as Literature and History unit texts. LightSail is an interactive eReader, designed to support students with their reader through accessibility settings, opportunities to share thoughts about texts, and regular comprehension checks. First, students will take a Power Test to assess their reading abilities and set up their personalized eLibrary. Everyday, your student will read books of their choosing from this library for their 40 minute, 6 days per week, independent reading time. They will also use LightSail to read assigned texts for their Literature and History classes.

Get to Know the Student Portal

Dashboard:

- Select Your Class → You can select your class when you first login and change classes once on your dashboard by clicking the downward arrow in the top right corner.
- Power Challenge → This is the first assignment. The reading and comprehension questions help the program design the personalized library.
- \circ Today's Homework \rightarrow Click here to access current assignments in this class.
- \circ Open Library \rightarrow Click here to access the personalized eLibrary
- Progress → See student data for minutes and words read, thoughts, Lexile reading level, and scores on MC
- Badges → Badges are earned when students read books and answer comprehension questions.
- Word Work → Learn about words and redo to the Cloze questions missed while reading to improve the assignment score and improve vocabulary.

Student Responsibilities

- Take the assigned Power Test.
- Read in the Independent Reading Class for 40 minutes, 6 days per week (minimum of 240 min.).
- Complete given classwork and homework assignments in the History and Llterature classes on LightSail.
- Students may also complete electronic reading logs and reading responses if they read books outside of the LightSail program. Templates are posted on Literature Google Classroom sites.
