#### **Option 1: Hybrid Learning**



Your child would physically come to PAVE 2-3 days a week, and stay at home the other days to learn remotely.

#### Option 2: 100% Remote Learning



Your child would stay at home and learn remotely each day of the week. Your child will be taught by their grade-level teacher and will have a set schedule each day.

# MASKS REQUIRED


While at PAVE, all students and adults will be REQUIRED to wear a mask at all times (except when eating or drinking).

A mask with PAVE's logo will be provided to all students.



#### **SOCIAL DISTANCING**





- 1. PAVE will enforce social distancing requirements for adults and students.
- 2. Signs and decals around the school will support students and adults with adhering to these protocols.
- 3. Classroom desks will be arranged at least 6 feet apart from each other.

#### **DEDENSIFYING**



- 1. 30% (or less) of students will be in the building at one time.
- 2. Classes will be broken into pods and sizes will vary between 9-13 students depending on size of classroom.

# CLEANING & DISINFECTING



- All PAVE's Facilities Team members have been trained on proper cleaning protocols to disinfect all areas of the building.
- PAVE will be disinfected with a non-toxic solution which has been proven to kill the Coronavirus.
- Areas of the building that are frequently used and touched (bathrooms, classrooms, offices, door handles) will be cleaned multiple times a day.
- PAVE has ensured that all air filters meet standards for optimum filtration.
- Additional disinfection and cleaning procedures in place in the event of a positive Covid-19 case













## MEALS AND SNACKS






Breakfast, lunch, and snack will all be eaten in classrooms.



Students and staff will all wash hands before and after eating meals and snacks.



Students are not allowed to share food.



Physical distancing- at least 6 ft.

## **HEALTH SCREENINGS**





- Students and Staff members will be asked to stay home if they are feelings sick / someone they live with is experiencing COVID symptoms
- Follow Department of Health protocols if a student/staff member is infected with COVID-19
- Daily symptoms checks- including temperature check
- Extended arrival and dismissal time

## **TECHEQUITY**



Student technology will be distributed to all students.

- K 2nd iPads
- 3rd 8th Chromebooks
- iPads and Chromebooks will be used at home and at school
- PAVE will work with all families to ensure they have internet access







# AT HOME LEARNING: ELEMENTARY SCHOOL





- All students start their day building classroom community through Morning Meeting
- 45 minute learning blocks including LIVE teaching sessions
- Weekly one on one students conferencing with their teacher
- All subjects have been converted to be supported digitally
- Small group instruction for Reading and Math
- Increase parent-teacher communication to support academic and technology concerns

# AT HOME LEARNING: MIDDLE SCHOOL (5th - 8th Grade)



- All students are expected to engage in and complete work
- Built in computer rest time for eyes
- 40-60 minute learning blocks
- All subjects have been converted to be supported digitally
- Major learning platforms Google Classroom, Zoom, MyOn, PowerSchool

# SOCIAL EMOTIONAL SUPPORT









#### Morning Meeting/Advisory

Creating space in the day for students to talk about what is happening in the world and their relationship to it.

Creating opportunities in the day for students to connect with adults for support

Staff learning about themselves to better support students (anti-racist educator)
